

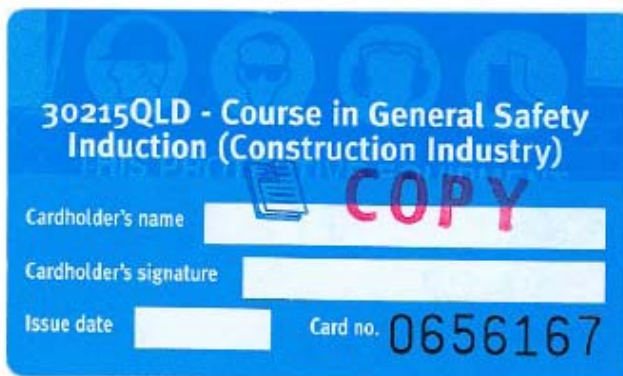
## Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland: Mutual recognition of construction OHS induction cards

Victorian “red cards” are now automatically recognised in New South Wales and Queensland.

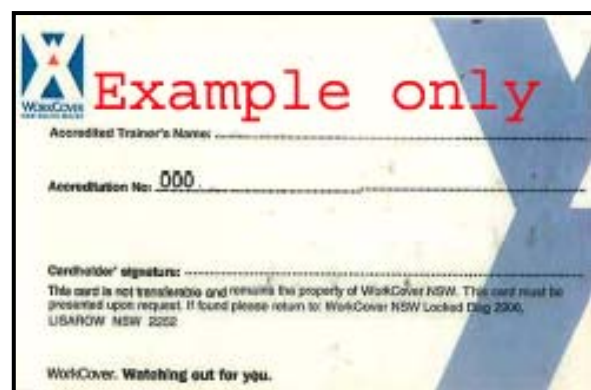
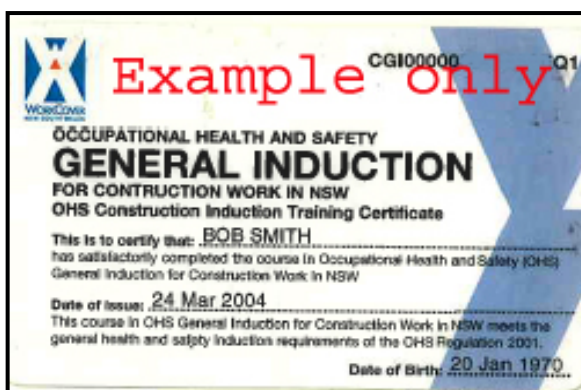
Queensland “blue cards” and NSW “white cards” are automatically recognised in Victoria.

Mutual recognition, which took effect on 1 January 2007, applies to valid proof-of-training cards of the three states’ construction OHS induction training schemes, namely those under:

- **NSW’s Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001**, and
- **Queensland’s Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995**, and
- **Victoria’s Foundations for Safety Construction Industry Induction Training Agreement 2001**.

**Note:** Old-style NSW “green cards” are no longer valid in NSW and are not recognised in Queensland. WorkSafe inspectors will continue to regard “green cards” as proof of construction induction training for the time being, pending the commencement of the proposed Victorian *Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007*. “Green card” holders returning to NSW will need to be re-inducted to obtain a “white card”.
